The Great Vigil of Easter with Holy Baptism and Reaffirmation of Baptismal Vows
April 19, 2025



Welcome to Trinity Episcopal Church.

Whoever you are and wherever you may be on your spiritual journey, we are glad you have joined us for worship. May you know the presence of the living God who welcomes you here. You are invited to participate in worship by using this leaflet and the **blue Hymnal**, and you are invited to sit, stand, or kneel as you are able. The full text of the prayers can be found in the **Red Book of Common Prayer** and are indicated with "BCP" in the leaflet.

A note on children, or anyone else who might not be able to sit still through a long service:

Jesus welcomed the little children, and so do we! We can abide with a little "joyful noise" at Trinity.

If you need to get up and walk around, the outer aisles of the sanctuary are available.

If you need to step out for any reason, the Upper Parish Hall (found through a doorway in the front left of the sanctuary, behind the organ console) has restrooms with a changing table,

as well as an area with couches and a children's area.

Please make yourselves comfortable and know that you are welcome.

The Lighting of the Paschal Candle

We gather in the Tower entrance on Water Street or sitting in the Sanctuary if you prefer. In the darkness, fire is kindled; after which the Bishop addresses the People:

Bishop:

Dear friends in Christ... Let us pray.

BCP 285

The Bishop prays the Collect.

People:

Amen.

The Paschal Candle is then lighted from the newly kindled fire and the People's candles are lighted (tilt the <u>unlit</u> candle towards the lighted candle). We process inside in the following order:

Thurifer, Assisting Priest, Presider, Readers, Choir, Acolyte, Candidates for Baptism and Reaffirmation with sponsors, and the People of God

We pause three times and sing:




The Exsultet is now sung as follows

The Liturgy of the Word

Bishop: Let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history, how he saved his people in ages past; and let us pray that our God will bring each of us to the fullness of redemption.

All are seated. Because of the reflective nature of the Vigil readings, the traditional responses after the readings are omitted.

I. The Story of Creation: Genesis 1:1-2:4a

Read by Bruce and Eleanor Fox

Response: Psalm 136:1-9, 23-26 in unison

Give thanks to the Lord because he is good. God's faithful love lasts forever!

Give thanks to the God of all gods- God's faithful love lasts forever.

Give thanks to the Lord of all lords-God's faithful love lasts forever.

Give thanks to the only one who makes great wonders-God's faithful love lasts forever.

Give thanks to the one who made the skies with skill-God's faithful love lasts forever.

Give thanks to the one who shaped the earth on the water-God's faithful love lasts forever.

Give thanks to the one who made the great lights-God's faithful love lasts forever.

The sun to rule the day— God's faithful love lasts forever.

The moon and the stars to rule the night—God's faithful love lasts forever!

God remembered us when we were humiliated—God's faithful love lasts forever.

All are invited to gather around the Baptismal Font.

The Presentation

Bishop:

The candidate for Baptism will now be presented.

Sponsors:

I present Matilda Elizabeth to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Bishop:

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian

faith and life?

Sponsors:

I will, with God's help.

Bishop:

Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Sponsors:

I will, with God's help.

Bishop:

Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Sponsors:

I renounce them.

Bishop:

Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of

God?

Sponsors:

I renounce them.

Bishop:

Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Sponsors:

I renounce them.

Bishop:

Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Sponsors:

I do.

Bishop:

Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Sponsors:

I do

Bishop:

Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Sponsors:

I do.

Bishop:

The other Candidate will now be presented.

Sponsor:

I present this person who desires to reaffirm his baptismal vows.

Bishop:

Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil?

Candidate:

I do.

Bishop:

Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

Candidate:

I do, and with God's grace I will follow him as my Savior and Lord.

Bishop: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life

in Christ?

People: We will!

Bishop: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own

baptismal covenant.

The Baptismal Covenant

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Bishop: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints,

the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Bishop: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread,

and in the prayers?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to

the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every

human being?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you cherish the wondrous works of God, and protect and restore the beauty and

integrity of all creation?

People: I will, with God's help.

Prayers for the Candidates

Bishop:

Let us now pray for these persons who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth and

for this person who has renewed their commitment to Christ.

After each bidding, the People respond:

People:

Lord, hear our prayer.

Then the Bishop prays the collect.

People:

Amen.

Thanksgiving Over the Water

Bishop:

The Lord be with you.

People:

And also with you.

Bishop:

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People:

It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Bishop:

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water... To him, to you, and to the Holy

Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever.

People:

Amen.

The Baptism

After the Baptism, the Bishop says

Bishop:

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

People:

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified,

proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The Reaffirmation

We pray for Richard and the Bishop lays hands on him. The Bishop adds a concluding Collect.

People:

Amen

All may greet the newly baptized and those who have reaffirmed their vows with joy!

At the Eucharist

The Easter Proclamation

Said three times

Bishop: Alleluia! Christ is risen!

People: The Lord is risen indeed! Alleluia!

The Altar candles are lighted from the Paschal Candle, the lights are turned on, and candles may be extinguished, then we sing together:



The Collect of the Day

Bishop: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Bishop: Let us pray. The Bishop prays the collect.

People: Amen

Epistle Reading Reader:

The Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

Easter Alleluia

All stand. After the Epistle, this Alleluia is traditionally sung three times by the Cantor, at successively higher pitches, with the Congregation repeating it each time:



The Bishop breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept, then all sing:



Communion of the People

All are welcome at the Table of the Lord, either for communion or a priestly blessing.

An usher will guide you up the center aisle if you choose to come forward.

For those who desire communion, you may receive the bread (or gluten free wafer) at the front of the altar.

We have two chalices: one on the right for sipping, and one on the left for intinction (dipping).

As always, receiving communion in one kind (just bread) is considered valid. If you prefer to receive a blessing, come to the altar with your arms crossed over your chest, and the Bishop will be honored to bless you.

If you need communion brought to your pew, please speak to an usher.

A note on safety: Hand sanitizer is available to the left of the altar.

What is the Easter Vigil?

The liturgy intended as the first (and arguably, the primary) celebration of Easter in the BCP (pp. 284-95). It is also known as the Great Vigil. The service begins in darkness, sometime between sunset on Holy Saturday and sunrise on Easter, and consists of four parts: The Service of Light (kindling of new fire, lighting the Paschal candle, the Exsultet); The Service of Lessons (readings from the Hebrew Scriptures interspersed with psalms, canticles, and prayers); Christian Initiation (Holy Baptism) or the Renewal of Baptismal Vows; and the Eucharist. Through this liturgy, the BCP recovers an ancient practice of keeping the Easter feast. Believers would gather in the hours of darkness ending at dawn on Easter to hear scripture and offer prayer. This night-long service of prayerful watching anticipated the baptisms that would come at first light and the Easter Eucharist. Easter was the primary baptismal occasion for the early church to the practical exclusion of all others. This practice linked the meanings of Christ's dying and rising to the understanding of baptism. (From the "An Episcopal Dictionary of the Church, A User Friendly Reference for Episcopalians," Don S.
